Meeting began with expectant quiet. The clerk read a selection from NPYM Faith and Practice (p. 40)

Consensus... is a good way to find a decision that is generally acceptable to most people involved, but it is not what Quaker meetings for business are really reaching for. The question is not "What do we want to do?" but rather "What do Truth and Love require of us."

**The January minutes were approved** as published in the newsletter.

**The Treasurer's Report** was presented and accepted with the clarification that "year to date" referred to 2019.

The proposed Budget for this year was distributed. Treasurer Wendy Robinson asked for the Meeting's decision on whether to continue the Meeting's ad in the *Corvallis Gazette-Times/Albany Democrat-Herald Newspaper*. This is paid for monthly. After some discussion, the Meeting approved leaving the amount as is while an ad hoc committee of Jonathan Stoll and John Selker investigate other possible venues for publicizing the Meeting.

Friends noted the need to budget sufficient funds for Meetinghouse and Grounds maintenance and approved \$2,000.00.

Meeting approved raising our donations to other organizations by 5%.

The *Budget* was approved with these changes. We expressed our gratitude to Wendy for her work.

John Selker reported that he shipped *Brigid's* remains and a family chest he had repaired. The Meeting will reimburse his expenses for this.

**Spiritual Care Committee:** asks for feedback on the new practice of inviting everyone to share something as part of introductions at the close of Meeting for Worship. They also wonder if there is interest in forming Friendly Sevens (small groups that meet together for meals).

Donna Gerry will act as *coordinator for rides for Friends*. She is working on an online calendar to help with scheduling these. The Meeting thanks Ruth McNeill for her work in establishing a system for responding to needs of Friends.

John Selker read letters from three attenders who are *applying for membership* in the Meeting: Patricia Omidian, Yalda Asmatey, Jonathan Stoll. As is our practice, Spiritual Care Committee will form Clearness Committees to meet with these applicants.

**Website:** Patricia Omidian reported the new website is up and more content will be put on it soon

**Art Coordinator:** Yalda Asmatey invites Friends to share their works of art in a celebration and a possible fundraiser. More details will emerge later.

**Adult Religious Exploration:** Bob Ward and Laurie Childers reported that the "Service Fair" with information about the various committees and roles within the meeting has been rescheduled to Sunday March 3.

**Major Meeting House:** Meeting expressed appreciation to Bob Burton for the motion activated light now on the bike rack shelter.

We noted that we need to make sure that space is maintained around the radiators in the Fellowship area.
