Meeting began in expectant quiet worship. The Clerk read the following:

Minutes of the previous month were approved as printed in the newsletter

A written **Treasurer's Report** was accepted with gratitude. Wendy noted that those wishing to donate stock should contact her for information on how to proceed.

Spiritual Care Committee Report was given by Judy. Many Friends helped Ruth McNeill and Bart get moved and settled in their new place. Judy recently attended a session given by North Pacific Yearly Meeting (which Corvallis Meeting is part of) for those serving on monthly meeting Spiritual Care Committees (NPYM uses the term Ministry and Counsel—individual meetings use various terms). She shared some of the experiences of other Meetings: small meetings are seeing a rise in attendance using videoconferencing, however

young people are not as involved in these. Families are involved in some Meeting events. An emphasis on conversation and connection is helpful. Judy shared that our walking worship is unique.

The Holiday Collection for the food banks is progressing well—donations are still welcome now and on December 20th. The Asmatey-Stoll children and the Smith-Watson children have been helpful in gathering, organizing and boxing donations and the Smith-Watson family will help carry donations on the 20th. John will provide his van and Bob Burton and Jay will transport the donations to the two banks that afternoon.

Adult Religious Exploration committee will meet December 20. They welcome feedback on the sharing session held on December 8th.

Jay shared a report from the **Threshing Sessions** on our Meeting's donations. After some clarification and discussion, Friends approved donating \$9,000 to local organizations. This will be divided between LBCC Diversity in Nursing scholarship fund—for immediate dispersal; Benton County Foundation; and Unity Shelter (their current fiscal agent is United Church of Christ).

Benton County Foundation meets Tuesday and need funds then—Wendy will write a check and Bob Ward will take it to that meeting.

The Meeting will also become a member of NAACP.

Prenominating Committee of Jay and Susan nominated Carmen Brummet to serve on the Nominating Committee for 2021-2023. Friends approved with gratitude to the committee and Carmen.
