JANUARY 2021 MEETING FOR BUSINESS MINUTES

Corvallis Friends Meeting for Worship for Business Sunday January 10, 2021

Meeting began in expectant quiet worship.

The minutes of December Meeting for Business were approved as published in the newsletter with the addition of Nancy Ewald as present

A written **Treasurer's Monthly Report** was presented. Wendy explained that the large amount for the water bill includes additional fees for city services. Donations were made to LBCC Foundation Diversity in Nursing Scholarship Fund and Benton County Foundation as approved last month. Meeting received a thank you from LBCC. Laurie shared that white male nursing students are included in the definition of "diversity."

Wendy will send out tax statements for donations made in 2020. A proposed budget for 2021 will be presented next month.

The report was accepted with gratitude.

Spiritual Care Committee is focusing on helping provide connection with and between Friends. They are also exploring the quality of worship during Meeting for Worship and are open to feedback on this. They will meet later this week.

Our annual State of the Meeting Report is due to Willamette Quarterly Meeting in May. Judy requested help from Friends in working on this. Laurie volunteered to write a first draft, and help as needed. Nominating Committee will be contacting Friends this month and will ask them about their feelings and experience of

connection with the meeting and with other Friends. We noted that the children were involved in the food drive and that Meeting for Worship on Zoom has attracted visitors.

Adult Religious Exploration will offer two sessions this month: Brene Brown on *The Power of Vulnerability* this coming Tuesday and *Participatory Storytelling about Following Our Leadings* with Friend Caroline Wildflower on 1-26. They are planning a future session on conflict resolution with Scott Smith and one on decolonization. Friends are encouraged to participate and provide feedback.

Peace Justice and Environment committee of the whole: Priorities for Friends Committee on National Legislation will include the repeal of the Authorization of Military Force and the US relationship with Iran.

Our Meeting's efforts towards our acknowledgement of the native land our Meetinghouse sits on and our anti-racism efforts have stalled temporarily but will continue.

Nominating Committee will be contacting Friends about how they wish to be involved in the life of the Meeting.

Phone service for the Meeting: the current arrangement is not working. An ad hoc committee, including Bob Ward, Nina, and John Selker, is currently exploring options. Meeting approved letting them and the Treasurer make a decision and purchase a service. We noted that we can always make a change if what we try first does not work well. Friends agree we would like a good internet connection at the Meetinghouse in the future.
