Corvallis Friends Meeting for Worship for Business November 14, 2021

Meeting was held in a hybrid fashion with some Friends present at the Meetinghouse and others participating through Zoom videoconferencing

Meeting began in expectant quiet worship.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

A written Treasurer's Report was provided with these notes:

The garbage bill was relatively high—this may reflect an extra pickup of yard waste

The Meeting should decide if it wants monthly brokerage account notices—Friends see no need for this.

The report was accepted.

Homeless outreach needs fiscal agent for propane program. Bob Burton and some others Friends have helped with a program which fills propane containers for homeless individuals who are camping in the area. The program would like to set up a GoFundMe fundraising account, but needs a bank account in order to receive funds. After some discussion about how this would work and the issues involved, **Friends approved having the Treasurer open an account in the Meeting's name to be used for this purpose for one year.**

Donations for the program would be deposited into this account and a debit card or check would be used for purchasing propane only. Friends will look into our Meeting's liability coverage to see if this might cause any issues for the Meeting. And will revisit this issue in a year. **Esther will provide a minute authorizing Wendy to open the account.**

Brigid Bonner is still listed as a signer on our Meeting accounts. Meeting approved a minute to remove her name. **Esther will provide a written Minute noting this so that her name can be removed.**

Spiritual Care Committee Report: *We met on 11/4 at the meeting house and virtually. We plan to meet again in a similar style on 12/7 at 7 p.m.*

As the Meeting continues to acquire technology and understanding we are continuing to blend more of our gatherings with virtual and in person modes. We have met in blended or hybrid fashion in committees, for eating, for threshing, and today for monthly business.

If Friends are so led, we could start having a blended meeting for worship. Whether to try this, when to start and how often should all be considered.

As we move forward in blending together, we will be making adjustments in equipment and arrangements. Friends will do well to remember that we can't expect to find some ideal solution quickly. Please expect continued evolution of our personal and technological accommodations. The Meeting will need your help as we seek workable solutions.

Our committee is clear that virtual potlucks are not our responsibility. We see nothing to prevent them from occurring and encourage any Friend who is led to announce them to do so.

After some discussion, Friends approved having a hybrid (or blended) Meeting for Worship on November 28th This will help Friends to decide about future hybrid Meetings. Some issues related to this need to be addressed:

1 alerting those entering the Meetinghouse that a video camera is broadcasting their images to others

2. who and how Meeting will be closed. It was noted that the physical and virtual Meeting for

In the past our meeting has collected donations of food and other items for the local food banks and held an event in December to celebrate and deliver these. Energy for doing this has waned this year. Jay volunteers with the Vina Moses Center Giving Tree program to provide gifts for needy families. Jay invited Friends to take a gift tag from the meeting house and return a gift there by 12/7 or to the Vina Moses Giving Tree Store by 12/14. The Asmatey-Stoll children are doing a food drive at their school. Friends could participate in one or both of these activities and/or share other opportunities for giving with Meeting members.
